New Executive Director to Head AMP Singapore

1. AMP Singapore has appointed Mr Mohksin Rashid, 36, as its new Executive Director, with effect from 1 September 2021. Mr Mohksin has more than a decade of experience working in the non-profit sector, including co-founding and subsequently, heading non-profit youth organisation, Majulah Community, as its Chief Executive Officer from 2014 to 2019.
2. Mr Mohksin has also been active in community work for close to two decades, having volunteered in non-profit organisations, mosques and youth groups since he was 18. His volunteer work includes chairing the steering committee of CLF Labs since 2018, and Honorary Secretary of the Mosque Management Board of Wak Tanjong Mosque, a position he has held since December 2020.
